 - Look specifically at the course/section notes on Course Explorer to make sure the section you're adding is not restricted to a certain major/student group.
- Figure out what balance works for you: Are you a morning person or are you more attentive later in the day? Do you like to have all your classes done on the same days, or do you need them spread out throughout the week?
- Pick courses that you genuinely are interested in, not ones that you feel you'll have to "suffer" through
 - You can complete your degree requirements while also enjoying them at the same time – the two aren't mutually exclusive (2)
